We will be watching 'The song of the Sea' and write our own version

- We will engage in shared reading sessions to develop reading strategies, fluency, expression, intonation and to build our vocabulary.
- Finally, we will write a fictional story using adjectives, conjunctions and adverbs of time (e.g. first, next, after that, finally).

RE

Who is Jewish, what do they believe and how do they live their lives?

The children will be revising what they have learnt earlier in the year. They will then be learning about a variety of Jewish festivals and celebrations including Hanukkah, Passover, Sukkot and Purim.

Science

Children look at how some plants can be grown and eaten for food. Previously, children planted seeds and observed changes in growth over time. They will discuss these changes to support new learning. Children will be introduced to the idea that much of the food on their plate comes from crops grown by farmers. They will create ideas for meals using a variety of commonly grown fruit and vegetables. The children will work practically to create a simple meal from different fruit and vegetables.
