Structures: Junk modelling

- Investigate tools and materials

Mathematics

- **Circles and triangles:** identify, name and compare circles and triangles, shapes in the environment, describe position
- **1 2 3 4 5:** find, subitise and represent 4 and 5, 1 more, 1 less, composition of number
- **Shapes with 4 sides:** identify, name and combine shapes with 4 sides, shapes in the environment
